

Pharmacy technicians perform a variety of duties in a pharmacy under the supervision of a licensed pharmacist, including receiving prescription medicine, counting tablets, labeling bottles, maintaining patient profiles, preparing insurance claim forms, and performing administrative functions such as answering phones, stocking shelves, and operating cash registers.

Students who are accepted will participate in a rigorous, online, year-long curriculum and be eligible to sit for the National Technician Certification exam.

Students will learn:

- ◆ Role of the pharmacy technician
- ◆ Laws governing pharmacy techs
- ◆ Pharmaceutical calculations
- ◆ Prescription processing
- ◆ Basic pharmacology

The class will be presented online through Pharmacy Technician's University online training. The instruction will include guidance provided by the instructor to assist students with the class requirements.

Students will be assigned online activities and quizzes that will require them to work independently and with their local pharmacist.

A local pharmacy connection will be needed to provide an observation time, as well as, completing an evaluation for the student. Shadowing of 10 fall hours and 25 spring hours is required for this program.



To become a Certified and Registered Pharmacy Technician:

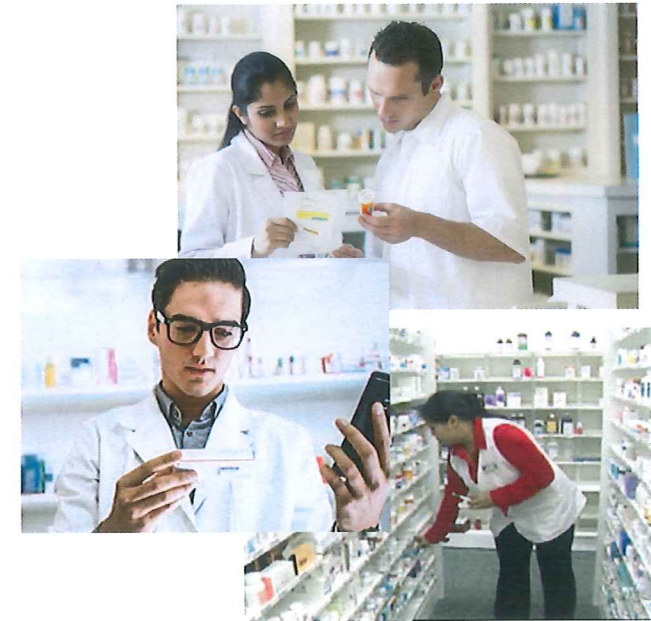
- Be a high school graduate or have a GED
- Be employed in South Dakota as a Pharmacy Technician
- Register with the SD Board of Pharmacy (\$25 fee)
- Pass the National Pharmacy Tech Certification Exam (exam fee \$129)

To be eligible to sit for the National Pharmacy Tech Certification Exam, a candidate must complete ONE of the following:

1. Successfully complete the Pharmacy Technician's University curriculum
2. Gain equivalent work experience as a pharmacy technician (minimum 500 hours)
